Our Vision

Growing Home envisions a thriving, healthy, and equitable society for all.











FOOD PANTRY

- Served 2,928 unduplicated households with 9,313 food pantry visits.
- Distributed 439,788 pounds of food, 32,760 diapers, 17,872 hygiene products, and 1,589 bags of pet food.

COMMUNITY GARDEN

- Grew and harvested **2,683** pounds of fresh produce.
- 97 community members contributed over 800 volunteer hours to sustain the community garden and harvest the produce.

FOOD JUSTICE

- Engaged 50 community members in a community-led campaign to increase access to high quality, low cost food in south Westminster.
- Conducted 11 food justice-focused community meetings.
- Developed a corner store outreach guide.
- Conducted a feasibility study to explore solutions for enhancing food access in our community.



FOOD

Growing Home provides access to healthy, culturally relevant food to our community through our food pantry, community garden, and food justice.






HOUSING STABILITY

- Assisted 220 households with rental assistance.
- **170** households engaged in case management.
- Distributed over \$650,000 in rental assistance funds.
- **95%** of households stably housed at program exit.
- 76% of households who completed program reduced housing cost burden.
- **85%** of households stably housed 3 months after exiting program.

HOUSING JUSTICE

- Facilitated renter's resource fair, renter's rights workshop, and housing policy information session.
- Community members met with elected officials to discuss the need for safe, secure, and affordable housing, food access, and more.
- Collaborated and partnered with multiple community organizations to improve housing safety.

PARENTS AS TEACHERS

Parents As Teachers (PAT) is an early childhood program designed to help families support their children's development, strengthen caregiver skills, and provide resources to help their children succeed in school.

- Supported 191 families in gaining a deeper understanding of their child's growth, development, and milestones.
- Provided 1,273 sessions on parenting education to families and facilitated 9 group connections for families.
- 79% of children enrolled in the program demonstrated on track development.
- 99% of caregivers demonstrated positive parenting behaviors.











PARENTING EDUCATION

Growing Home helps caregivers acquire the skills and resources they need to ensure their children and future generations are on a path to a brighter future.

This includes education and coaching on child development and parenting practices that help prepare kids for a lifetime of success. Our programs are evidence-based and support a two-generation approach to poverty alleviation.



COLLABORATIVE COACHING

Growing Home offers a commitment-based Collaborative Coaching program that supports participants in advancing their long-term self-sufficiency and economic stability. Collaborative Coaching is an evidence-based, case management system that supports participants in setting goals to enhance their stability and pathways to achieving those goals.

- 55 participants engaged in collaborative coaching case management.
- 76% of participants took steps toward stability by setting and meeting personal goals each quarter.
- 63% of participants increased their Bridge to Self Sufficiency score.
- Participants who successfully completed the program increased their household income by an average of 20%.





LIFELONG STABILITY

Growing Home helps individuals and families achieve and maintain lifelong stability through our programs by identifying and prioritizing personal goals, building skills, providing resources, creating action plans, and contributing to their community in meaningful ways.





VOLUNTEERING

- **300 volunteers** provided **10,158 hrs** to support the mission of Growing Home.
- Partnered with over 30
 organizations to meet community
 needs.
- Additionally, responded to over
 5,000 inquiries for information, assistance, and resource navigation.









To carry out Growing Home's mission of cultivating a thriving, healthy, and equitable North Metro Denver, Growing Home relies on the help of many dedicated volunteers who work alongside our staff. Our work connects people to services and programs to drive community action in the areas of food, housing, parenting education, and lifelong stability.





ADVOCACY, POLICY, AND COMMUNITY TRAININGS

- Conducted multiple community trainings in areas of public speaking for advocacy efforts, state policy engagement, traumainformed de-escalation, gardening, and food access.
- In collaboration with partners, hosted a 2-day health insurance enrollment event for people not covered by Medicaid (OmniSalud).
- Facilitated and convened charitable food sector partners to successfully build a unified statewide funding strategy.
- Growing Home endorsed the Food Pantry Assistance Grant Program Reauthorization and Expansion (SB23-027), Local Control of Rents (HB23-1115), and Just Cause Eviction (HB23-117).





Growing Home believes that thriving and equitable communities can exist when we tap into the resiliency and leadership of the participants with whom we work.




